

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**University of Guelph – 10 Carden Rooftop Engagement Session

**University connections: Karen Landman (Associate Dean), Mike Barker (University sessional & owner of SHIFT Landscape Architecture), Lise Burcher (past Sessional, past director of Federation of Canadian Municipalities, 10C Board member)**

Presentation of 10C rooftop slides to University students from landscape architecture program (both undergraduate and graduate students participated). 10 Carden gave a presentation to the students related to urban agriculture, rooftop case studies, design considerations and charrette guidelines. After presentation students formed 5 groups ranging in size from 3-5 participants in each. The groups were given 2 hours to create a theme, concept, draw a plan plus a section or perspective detail to illustrate their rooftop design.

Students were provided a tour of the 10 Carden facility – tour included an overview of the container garden patio, gallery space, office space, future community kitchen and the rooftop. After the tour and presentation students were provided lunch – including salad greens harvested from our self-watering container beds.

At the end of the 2-hour intensive design session students were invited to present their rooftop vision. Each student group pinned up their illustrations on the wall. Panel members from the University of Guelph and local landscape architects listened to a 3-minute presentation and provided a critique of the design. Critiques & feedback focused on the function and aesthetics of the rooftop space in context to the surrounding streetscape and downtown buildings. Charrette illustrations were kept to display in the 10 Carden gallery for public viewing and to build enthusiasm and awareness to the rooftop project.
